Supply Chain and Further Steps

We take our responsibilities as a corporate citizen seriously and hold ourselves to exacting standards in this regard. We require our suppliers, through our contracts and other business documentation, to adhere to all applicable legal requirements and best industry practices, and specifically bar all suppliers from using any form of forced labor. Our procurement and sourcing functions perform due diligence on our suppliers including onsite visits where necessary.

Going forward, we are assessing the incorporation of the requirements of a formal code of conduct into our supplier business documentation as well as revisions to our existing requirements to further reflect modern slavery legislation and best practices.
